

## STUDENT PROGRESS REPORTS TO PARENTS

### Elementary Schools, K-5

- **Parent-Teacher Conferences**

Parent-teacher conferences are held each fall so that teachers may report each child's academic progress, social interaction, and effort. Parents or guardians may also contact teachers to request a meeting at other times of the year.

- **Report Cards**

Report cards are issued in November, March and on the last day of school (in Kindergarten, reports are issued twice). Parents or guardians are encouraged to discuss grades and progress with the teacher. The elementary schools use four separate reporting formats: Kindergarten, Grade 1, Grades 2-3, Grades 4-5.

### Middle School, Grades 6-8

- **Parent-Teacher Conferences**

Parent-teacher conferences are held in late November and early December (2 evenings and 3 release-time afternoons) so that teachers may report each student's academic progress, social interaction, and effort. Parents or guardian may also contact teachers to request a meeting at other times during the year.

- **Report Cards**

Report cards are issued 4 times per year: late November, February, April, and at the end of the year, the final report card is mailed home.

### High School, Grades 9-12

- **Parent-Teacher Conferences**

Parent-teacher conferences are held in late November and early December. Parent visitation evenings are organized alphabetically: the first group A-K usually meets in late November and the second group, L-Z, usually meets in early December. One afternoon release-time is scheduled in late November for any parents/guardians who cannot attend the evenings.

- **Report Cards**

Report cards are issued 4 times per year: end of November, February, April, and at the end of the year, the final report card is mailed home.
